<b>A</b>	Entropion	Entropion at age of 3-5 months, usually corrected prior to first eye certification	Unknown	NO	1
<b>B</b>	Distichiasis	21% incidence in Switzerland, sometimes severe, causing clinical signs	Unknown	NO	1
<b>C</b>	Cataract	22% incidence in Switzerland (all types) Variable expression, usually posterior polar, but anterior cortical also seen	Unknown	NO	1
<b>D</b>	Persistent Pupillary Membranes - iris to iris		Unknown	NO	1

<b>E</b>	Retinal dysplasia -folds		Unknown	NO	1
